Message from our Pastor

Dear Parishioners of Little Flower, Our Lady of Mt. Carmel, and St. Mary's,

We are grateful for the safe return of some of the pilgrims from the Holy Land. There were three priests and 84 pilgrims from North Dakota and Minnesota in Israel when the war started. They are in the process of getting home through Amman, Jordan. Let us continue to pray that all of them will be safely home soon.

October is the month of the Rosary. Let us put the Rosary to good use for peace in the Middle East and that the war will not expand throughout the Middle East or to other parts of the world.

Let us pray for the Church. The Holy Father is meeting with others in Rome for the "Synod on Synodality" and there is concern of the possible change in the teaching of the Church. The Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith has clearly stated that; "...it is not licit to impart a blessing on relationships, or partnerships, even stable, that involve sexual activity outside of marriage (i.e., outside the indissoluble union of a man and a woman open in itself to the transmission of life), as is the case of the unions between persons of the same sex. The presence in such relationships of positive elements, which are in themselves to be valued and appreciated, cannot justify these relationships, and render them legitimate objects of an ecclesial blessing, since the positive elements exist within the context of a union not ordered to the Creator's plan. — "Responsum of the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith to a dubium regarding the blessing of the unions of persons of the same sex.", March 15, 2021; press.vatican.va.


Parish ministers bring the Holy Eucharist to the homebound and the hospitalized. Please call the parish office to arrange for visitation.
